

## Frequently Asked Questions and Answers

Q. Who comes to the schoolroom?

A. All children of school age who are considered well enough by the Doctors and Nurses.

Q. When is the school open?

A. The school is open from 9am-12 noon.

Q. Where is the schoolroom?

A. The schoolroom is on the right, half way down the corridor towards the exit. Opposite the teenage room.

Q. What if I am ill or in pain?

A. Your nurse will check you at intervals during the morning and we will get your Nurse and Parents for you, if you need them.

Q. What kind of work will we do?

A. You will not be given a test. There is a wide range of practical and written activities you can choose from. There are several computers, two of which are connected to the internet. You can also send faxes and E-mails.

Q. Do we have a break?

A. Refreshments are provided for those who are allowed to eat.

Q. Why do we have school in hospital?

A. To break up a long day and stop you getting bored, to introduce you to other patients and help you keep up with your schoolwork.
