Advice for patients attending nurse specialist respiratory outpatient appointments during coronavirus (Covid-19)

In order to protect patients, staff, and the public, and practice effective social distancing, we are introducing new arrangements for Outpatient appointments. Please read carefully the instructions below.

Before attending your appointment

Please answer the following questions:

Do you have any new symptoms of a cough?
Do you have a fever/high temperature?
Do you have a change or loss of taste and/or smell?
Do you have any new symptoms of shortness of breath?
Have you been in contact with anyone who has either a cough or fever in the 14 days prior to your appointment?
Have you been in contact with anyone confirmed to be coronavirus positive?

If you have answered '**YES**' to any of the above, please **DO NOT** attend the department. Instead, telephone the respiratory department on 01305 255259 as soon as possible for advice or for your appointment to be rebooked. **Please refer to 111 or the Government website for further advice if needed.**

Attending your appointment

If you have answered 'NO' to all of the above questions, you may attend your appointment.

arrive no earlier than 10 minutes prior to your allocated time slot. be on time . If you are running late, contact the department on 55259 before coming to the hospital, as we may have to rearrange pointment. If you are arriving by patient transport please contact artment for additional any instructions
hould be washed frequently for 20 seconds each time, at home, oming into the hospital and regularly, as needed, eg after touching e or using the toilet. nake use of the hand sanitiser at main and department entrances I and departure at the Trust.
use a cloth covering on attendance at the Trust. Guidance on how a cloth covering is available on the Government website (detailed f you are not able to bring one with you, please contact the ent prior to your appointment. If you are required to remove it, you sked to do so by a clinician.
to comply with social distancing rules, to the best of your ability, eep 2 metres apart from other people wherever possible and e signs and directions in the Trust. Where possible, please keep EFT in corridors. any diagnostic tests be required eg blood tests, you might not be vait for these as before and may need to return to the hospital on a ccasion to have them done.

Please be aware that front line staff will be wearing full protective clothing for everyone's safety.

We understand that many of our patients may be shielding at this time. We have tried to make sure you are at as low a risk as possible. If you fall into this category and are still concerned about attending, please let us know as soon as possible.
