Caring for your Mouth Guard

This leaflet has been written for patients fitted with a mouth guard to protect the teeth during contact sports.

What should I do when I get my new mouth guard?

- Rinse your new mouth guard in cold water before use
- Try it in to check it fits well and is comfortable
- Wear it during training to get used to the unusual feeling of having a mouth guard in your mouth.



How do I care for/clean my new mouth guard?

- Rinse it with cold water before and after use
- Do not clean your mouth guard in boiling/hot water or apply any direct heat
- Your mouth guard should be cleaned with a toothbrush and liquid soap
- Store your mouth guard in the **box provided**.

You should tell your dentist:

- If you have any form of irritation from the mouth guard
- If it no longer fits properly
- If it becomes damaged or shows signs of deterioration
- If you have an accident whereby the mouth guard has been subjected to a force or impact

• If there is any damage to your teeth.

How often should I get a new mouth guard made?

• After one sporting season.

Please note

- Under **no** circumstances should the mouth guard be worn by any other person than the person for whom it was custom made, and **no** modification should be made to the design
- The device conforms to the essential requirements set out in annex 1 of the Medical Devices Directive 93/42/EC. MHRA Reg. No. CA 003410
- The device is supplied in a non-sterile state.
